



Nancy Mallett

Archivist

Nancy Mallett was appointed Chair of the Archives and Museum at St. James' Cathedral in 1998, and now presides over a committee of 28 working volunteers (with another 15 available on call) providing the equivalent hours-per-day of close to three full-time positions. A volunteer herself, Nancy worked for over 20 years in the Department of Museum

Volunteers at The Royal Ontario Museum. She also chaired an educational working committee for Heritage Toronto's Museum of Toronto Project and was Programs Chair on the Board of the Children's Discovery Museum. She curated four major exhibits during the 10 years she served as Vice-Chair of the Toronto District School Board's Museum and Archives, and was on the Board of The Town of York Historical Society responsible for Toronto's First Post Office Museum. Nancy holds a Certificate in Museum Studies from the Ontario Museum Association, graduated in the pilot course on Arts Administration at Humber College, and pursued further studies in the field in Europe after taking an early retirement option from a full career in education. A graduate of the University of Toronto, she pursued graduate studies at London, Harvard and Temple Universities, and completed her principal qualifications at Laurentian. She served as a teacher, consultant, and principal with the Toronto Board of Education, and gave many in-service summer courses for teachers through the Ministry of Education in Manitoba and Ontario. Among the highlights of her career in education was giving a principal's course in Grenada, West Indies through the Canadian Teacher's Federation and the Grenada Union of Teachers, and teaching English to doctors and engineers in Czechoslovakia.
